Canadian Sigs put on an Olympic performance

We're proud to announce that Sigma Chi had a strong showing at the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics.

David Carter (*Delta Omicron, 2004*) was in Beijing as goalkeeper of the men's field hockey team. Dave joined eight other members of the UBC Thunderbirds field hockey team at the Olympics, where they finished 10th place overall, Canada's best result in Olympic Field Hockey. Congratulations Dave!

Donovan Tildesley (*Delta Omicron, 2008*) was the flag-bearer for Canada at the opening ceremonies of the Beijing Paralympic Games. Donovan is a visually impaired swimmer and has competed in two previous Paralympic Games. He currently holds the world records in the 800m and 1500m men's freestyle, and many other Canadian records.

Though Donovan did very well in all his races, including a fourth place finish in the final of the S11 class 100m Freestyle event, his best result came in the final of the S11 400m Freestyle, where he won the Bronze Medal. The S11 category is the name given to the division that features completely blind swimmers. Donovan now has two Silver and three Bronze medals in his Olympic swimming career. Congratulations Donovan!

chairman's letter

In these uncertain times that we now find ourselves, there is one thing that we can be certain of and that is the need for strong values-based leadership. The development of such leaders is central to the mission of Sigma Chi. Thanks to the ongoing support of many, I am pleased to report that Sigma Chi in Canada is in a period of renewal and is truly making a difference in the lives of our undergraduate brothers who are tomorrow's leaders.

Under the superb leadership of George Fierheller, our national capital campaign raised over \$1.4 million in cash and pledges. The national campaign was designed in support of the unique local housing needs of our nine Canadian chapters. Each chapter participated in the campaign to varying degrees. A key driver of success was directly attributable to the efforts of local chapter campaign chairmen and their hardworking committees. This should not really come as any surprise. Even for those chapters that may not have been as successful to date in dollar terms, improvements are underway to house corporations operations and alumni relations towards building better ties to their alumni in support of their undergraduate brothers.

A special thank you must also go to our Honourary Campaign Chair Ted Rogers who very generously provided a partial match of funds to our younger chapters to kick start their campaign efforts as well as a lead gift to his home chapter Beta Omega's campaign efforts.

A few highlights of the campaign include two of our younger chapters Theta Psi (*Waterloo*) & Iota Rho (*Bishop's*) raising sufficient funds to be able to secure a permanent home for their chapters in the next couple of years. This is particularly significant as these are the last two Canadian chapters who still rent temporary housing. As well, Beta Omega (*Toronto/Ryerson*) did a major basement renovation that included a new kitchen. And Gamma Lambda (*McGill*) installed a new roof, new furnace and some fire safety upgrades on its ongoing project list of repairs to an aging building.

Regretfully this spring, long time board member & secretary Jim Grimes entered the Chapter Eternal. Jim was a mentor and friend to many and will be dearly missed. He truly exemplified what is noblest and best about Sigma Chi.

The Sigma Chi Fraternity has recognized more than 1,300 brothers since the Significant Sig award's inception at the 1935 Grand Chapter. This award recognizes the exceptional success of Brothers in their professional endeavours.

MICHAEL J. BRYANT ~ 2007 SIGNIFICANT SIG
British Columbia 1988, Attorney General for the Province of Ontario

Brother Bryant was selected for recognition in honour of his exemplary career in public office. First elected to the Ontario Legislature in 1999 and re-elected in 2003 and 2007. Michael was appointed Attorney General and Minister Responsible for Democratic Renewal in 2003 where he oversaw a prolific agenda of legislation and program renewal. Brother Bryant then served as Minister of Aboriginal Affairs. Currently, he is the Minister of Economic Development and Government House Leader. Brother Bryant was on hand at the 2007 Toronto Alumni Banquet to accept his award.



EDWARD S. ROGERS JR. ~ 2008 SIGNIFICANT SIG
Western Ontario 1992, President & CEO, Rogers Cable Inc.

Rogers started his career at Comcast Corporation in the United States after he graduated from the University of Western Ontario. He spent two-and-a-half years there, in sales and product development. In 1996, he left Comcast to work for the family's company, as a vice president of the Rogers Wireless subsidiary. In 1998, he moved over to the cable television side, first serving as vice president and general manager for the Toronto division. In 2000, Rogers was named senior vice president of planning and strategy for Rogers Communications. In February 2003, he assumed his current post as President & CEO, Rogers Cable.

University of Toronto/Ryerson ~ Beta Omega

In 2006-2007, Beta Omega, led by Consul Ryan Niemann, focused on improving some key aspects of the chapter. Recruitment saw 12 worthy student leaders enter our order. In our philanthropic endeavours, led by Denny Zhen (2007 Chapter Balfour recipient), we raised over \$10,000 for local charities. With a strong showing on all fronts of chapter affairs, the chapter earned its first Peterson Significant Chapter Award since 1985, as well as the Bash Significant Improvement Award.

In 2007-2008, Consul Song Lu and executives pushed to sustain the healthy chapter environment. A greater focus on Ryerson recruitment significantly increased numbers from that campus. Finances were kept strong by Brother Patel (2008 Chapter Balfour recipient), Quaestor for the past two years. Beta Omega also received a sponsorship deal from Monster Energy, ensuring high quality events (and drinks) throughout the year. All in all, it was another great year and Beta Omega received its second consecutive Peterson award. Over the summer, we sent 12 brothers to BLTW, our largest contingency in recent history.

Under the leadership of Consul Peter Panacci, and featuring an expanded alumni advisory board, Beta Omega is placing more emphasis than ever on generating positive campus presence and training more leaders for the future of the chapter.

University of British Columbia ~ Delta Omicron

Thanks in part to the hard work of our Peterson chairman, Keith Martin, 2010, the chapter Executive, and all our brothers, we have recently been honoured with a 2007-2008 Peterson Significant Chapter Award. With 22 brothers having recently graduated, a determined effort will be needed to maintain the large presence we have established on campus. With men like Keith Martin, 2010, Patrick Cuthbert, 2008, and Michael MacDonald, 2009, all of whom biked across Canada to raise money for Muscular Dystrophy, and Beijing Olympians Donovan Tildesley, 2008 (world record swimmer, Canadian Flag Bearer), and David Carter, 2004 (field hockey goalkeeper), we are in a good position to attract more great men into our organization. We are also faced with the challenge of surpassing last year's Derby Days total of \$10,000 raised for the Children's Miracle Network.

Christopher James "Jim" Grimes, born November 9, 1932, in Elora, Ontario, entered the Chapter Eternal on Saturday April 5, 2008, at the age of 75.

At Western in 1956, he walked without canes but used braces, He never complained, always smiling and positive, as he struggled up University driveway and around the campus. No one ever asked him about his disability or offered help and he never offered any explanation and never asked for help.

Jim, a founding member, was enshrined as number two in the roll book of the Epsilon Omicron chapter at the University of Western Ontario in 1957. He authored the application for Chi Delta Sigma, a local, unaffiliated fraternity at the University of Western Ontario, to join the Sigma Chi Fraternity. Brother Bill Andrews recalls, "We were a close cohesive group, one of those rare circumstances in life where everybody got along with each other and had a good time".

While he worked in the senior ranks of Ontario's civil service, Jim continued his connection with the fraternity, playing a prominent role in the restoration of the beautiful panelled library at Epsilon Omicron in memory of Brother Bob Varah, who was also a co-founder of the Epsilon Omicron chapter. Jim was also one of the organizers of the 75th Anniversary Celebration of Sigma Chi in Canada in 1997, receiving a Grand Consul's Citation for each of these roles. He served as President of the EO Housing Corporation and helped with the fundraising campaign to restore the Epsilon Omicron chapter house following the disastrous fire in 1987. In 1996, Jim was inducted as a member of The Order of Constantine of Sigma Chi, the highest honour attainable for service within our fraternity.

His work as a Director and Secretary of the Sigma Chi Canadian Foundation has helped to make the mission of the Foundation, "To Strengthen Sigma Chi in Canada", more meaningful to each of the chapters, brothers, and alumni. Jim's gift to the world was his bravery, determination, and strength in dealing with his handicap. He was a quiet, unspoken inspiration to anyone that met him, showing that life's problems were not to be feared, only conquered. He impressed those who had the opportunity to be associated with him with his keen intellect, his interest in history, his jovial nature, and his positive outlook, in spite of physical challenges that seemed only to make him stronger in spirit. To quote Jim, "all my life people have thought of me as disabled, but in Sigma Chi, I am treated as a brother". He is a fine example of the determination, persistence, and spirit of our original founders 153 years ago. Jim was a shining example of the indomitable Sigma Chi spirit.

We will miss you, Brother Christopher James Grimes.

Beta Omega house renovations

Like a trench warfare scene from a World War I movie, the basement of the Beta Omega house in Toronto was an odd sight last summer. Completed in the early sixties, the third official house of the Beta Omega chapter has seen many generations pass through its doors. Through the years, it has withstood events, and brothers, that would have caused any ordinary house to cave in.

Over the past few years, the Beta Omega Housing Corporation took on the duty of renovating the basement. Commencing at the beginning of summer, 2007, this was the first complete overhaul of the basement since it was originally built. Costing over \$110,000, Phase One saw the complete reconstruction of the kitchen, floors, ceiling, walls, pipes, and lighting in the basement, as well as the addition of a new laundry room, locker storage area, and gas fireplace. With the first phase completed at the end of 2007, the housing corporation is now looking forward to Phase Two, which will include new washrooms and a renovation of the front porch area.

We would like to thank everyone who has supported the project thus far. In particular, we would like to express our deepest appreciation to Brother Doug McIntyre (*Beta Omega, 1973*) for his generous donation and this time and efforts in coordinating the entire project, as well as Brother Edward Rogers (*Beta Omega, 1955*) for his generous matching donation.
